Research Goals

The goals of this user research are to:

Research Method

To accomplish this, I will initially interview four users that are between 18-41 years old, that live in San Francisco, CA. All the interviewees have full time jobs and busy lives. They are economically independent, and they have middle class income.

Notes and Observations

The first interviewee mentioned several times that she would like the use of attachments in the app. I've never heard this suggestion before while using and searching for reminder apps, it was pretty refreshing to hear such an interesting idea. She also mentioned a few times the importance of having several alarms in the app for her reminders because she tends to forget the activities on her calendar.

The second interviewee used digital tools and he also writes them on a white board. It was also interesting when he mentioned to have SIRI linked to our reminder app. He thinks that linking the app to social media depending on what you do, or if you have a business account, and the app being accessible for iWatches was something I hadn't thought about until he said it.

The third interviewee mentioned that it was very important for her to be able to go back to check and organize her reminders. She'd like to be able to use stickers and have a check off list with bubbles where she can check off the tasks that are important for her. She needs to have an app that can keep her up to date.

The suggestions for the fourth interviewee were very interesting because she thought about how to use the app for her personal use and for work. She also said that wants an app that can do the work for her, with easy access, alarms and labels with different colors depending on her

priorities. She said that having the app linked to Alexa would be important. She gave me pretty good ideas on how to create a useful app for business and personal use.

Introduction
